GERALDINE R. DODGE FOUNDATION ANNOUNCES 65 GRANTS TOTALING \$3.5 MILLION

(Morristown, NJ) At its recent board meeting, the Trustees of the Geraldine R. Dodge Foundation approved 65 grants totaling \$3.5 million to arts, education, environment and media nonprofit organizations throughout New Jersey.

"New Jersey's nonprofit community continues to rise to the challenges of the day, turning inspiration and passion into action to build resilient, sustainable and creative communities throughout our state," said Dodge President and CEO Chris Daggett.

The Dodge Foundation makes grant decisions three times a year. In addition to this round of grants, there will be announcements in July and December. Highlights of the grants in this round include:

ARTS

The Dodge Foundation funds arts nonprofits which pursue and demonstrate the highest standards of artistic excellence in the performing and visual arts; enhance the cultural health and richness of communities; inspire learning and understanding; and contribute to New Jersey's creative economy.

Thirty arts grants totaling \$1.35 million include: **George Street Playhouse** (\$75,000), for its mainstage productions and educational touring programs and in celebration of its 40th anniversary; **Montclair Art Museum** (\$75,000) for continued operating support and in celebration of its 100th anniversary; **Carolyn**

Dorfman Dance Company (\$50,000) to support its 2013-2014 touring and residency season; and **Valley Arts** (\$30,000) to support expanded visual and performing arts programs and to attract and serve artists in the Valley Arts District.

EDUCATION

The Dodge Foundation funds Education nonprofits which promote critical and creative thinking for young people and their teachers in New Jersey's high needs districts through district-wide strategic arts education planning and transformational, experiential arts education opportunities. The Foundation also funds organizations which enhance teacher and principal quality with a focus on improving student outcomes.

Fourteen Education grants totaled \$1,073,000, including: **New Jersey Arts Education Partnership** (\$150,000) for their statewide support of statewide arts education efforts, **William Paterson University's College of Education** (\$130,000) for three Creativity Professors-in-Residence to work with teachers, student teachers, and administrators throughout the 2014-15 school year in four Paterson schools; **GlassRoots** (\$45,000) to provide support for glassmaking programs and education to at-risk youth in the greater Newark area; and **Little Kids Rock** (\$75,000) for their modern band pedagogy in Newark and Jersey City, and targeted expansion initiatives in Paterson and Trenton.

ENVIRONMENT

The Dodge Foundation funds non-profit organizations striving to achieve ecosystem resilience and environmentally healthy, sustainable communities in New Jersey.

In this round, 15 grants totaling \$870,000 will support the protection and stewardship of critical watersheds and water resources, and greening of urban communities. The grants include: **Trust for Public Land** (\$125,00) to advance land preservation projects in critical watersheds and implement urban park and playground development; **Student Conservation Association** (\$35,000) for New Jersey-focused park and watershed conservation stewardship programs which enhance, restore, repair and increase accessibility to public lands in New Jersey; and **Cooper's Ferry Partnership** (\$40,000) to advance the Camden SMART Initiative, a replicable model for resident-driven stormwater management and urban green infrastructure.

MEDIA

The Dodge Foundation makes Media grants to nonprofits that provide high-quality, New Jersey-focused news and information across multiple platforms and help foster civic participation in issues of importance to New Jersey.

Two organizations received \$140,000 in this round of grants, including **Montclair State University's NJ News Commons** initiative (\$125,000) which serves as a centralized and virtual resource center for New Jersey's news ecosystem, building strategic alliances with New Jersey media entities, providing on-campus office space, studio facilities, training and student internships, and fostering resource sharing and collaborative reporting opportunities; and **PatersonPress.com** (\$15,000) for its continued investigative coverage within the city of Paterson.

MORRISTOWN, TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE & PUBLIC POLICY

In the Dodge Foundation's hometown of Morristown, **Grow It Green Morristown** received a grant of \$20,000 for continued support of its operations, which includes its Urban Farm and Early Street Community Garden, as well as its bi-weekly farm stand and fresh produce distribution to local nonprofits and the Morristown High School cafeteria.

Additionally, Dodge made two Technical Assistance grants to: **Lead New Jersey** (\$50,000) for continued support of its leadership program exploring some of New Jersey's most challenging issues; and **Environmental Leadership Program** (\$35,000) to train emerging NJ environmental and social change leaders in the 2014 Eastern Regional Network.

Dodge also made a grant of \$25,000 to the **Council of New Jersey Grantmakers** in continued support of the Newark Philanthropic Liaison which seeks to improve Newark through collaboration between grantmakers and government partners.
